Spelling Menu

Each week you should try to use **different methods** to practise your spellings and keep it interesting.

There are examples on the next page to help you.

1. Ask an adult to scramble your spelling words for you. See if you can unscramble your spellings in 3 minutes.	2. Write each spelling word and then write at least two words that can be made from the word.	3. Write all of your words replacing the vowels with a line. Then, go back and see if you can fill in the vowels from memory in another colour or pen.	4. See if you can write one or two sentences that contain all of your spelling words.
5. Write an antonym or synonym for each word.	6. Write each word three times using a different colour, different pen or pencil for each word.	7. Divide each word into syllables.	8. Create a cartoon strip using at least half of your words.
9. Write each spelling word in a continuous line to form a picture or design.	10. Write a news article using half of your spelling words.	11. Write five of your words in bubble print and decorate.	12. Classify each word by parts of speech. Is it a noun? Is it a verb? No, it's an adjective!
13. Write a conversation between two people that includes at least half of your spelling words (the trickiest ones!).	14. Sort your words based on parts of speech; number of syllables, number of letters etc.	15. Write a poem using one of your spelling words in each line.	16. Draw a spelling scribble.
