## Spelling Mentr

Each week you should try to use different methods to practise your spellings and keep it interesting.
There are examples on the next page to help you.

1. Ask an adult to scramble your spelling words for you. See if you can unscramble your spellings in 3 minutes.
2. Write an antonym or synonym for each word.
3. Write each spelling word in a continuous line to form a picture or design.
4. Write a conversation between two people that includes at least half of your spelling words (the trickiest ones!).
5. Write all of your words
replacing the vowels with a line. Then, go back and see if you can fill in the vowels from memory in another colour or pen.
6. See if you can write one or two sentences that contain all of your spelling words.
7. Create a cartoon strip using at least half of your words.
8. Classify each word by parts of speech. Is it a noun? Is it a verb? No, it's an adjective!
9. Sort your words based on parts of speech; number of syllables, number of letters etc.
10. Write a poem using one of your spelling words in each line.
11. Draw a spelling scribble.

Remember yours will be longer and bigger because you have more than 2 words to learn!
