E-Safety Newsletter — As a parent of school age children I know and empathise how hard it can be to keep children safe online. To help with conversations with your children, it may be helpful to know that to use TikTok you must be over 13 years of age. Behaviour Monitoring and Policy – As part of our trust (TPAT), we get support and monitoring. Behaviour Lead Tina Leack spent a day with us on 22nd February and reported, amongst other very positive findings: "Children at Pendeen care about each other, staff make them feel safe because their responses are predictable. Behaviour Lead Tina Leack observed and experienced good manners, empathy and kindness between adults and children all day."

Following the visit, we are making some changes to our behaviour policy, and adding the following procedures on occasions where a child is not following school rules:

Warnings:

- 1. Non-verbal indication
- 2. Verbal reminder of what the child should be doing (rather than highlighting what they are doing wrong)
- 4. Move to paired room. This can be flexible and based on the needs, age and relationships of the children for example we may not want a child to go to a class where they have a sibling. Parents will be informed via e-mail when a child has spent some time in a paired class.
- 5. If behaviour continues in paired class, or continues when back in their own class, the child will be sent to Chris Wilson or Chris Summerfield if Chris Wilson not in school. At this point, parents will be asked to meet with Chris Wilson / Chris Summerfield and the class teacher at the end of the day or as soon as possible.
- 6. If there is physical or verbal harm to another child or member of staff then the child will be sent straight to Chris Wilson or Chris Summerfield.
