Traffic Calming Measures – Advance Warning – As you will no doubt be aware, there have been a number of road traffic accidents and near misses in and around the school in recent years. The governing body and myself, along with Jason Jackson Williams from the shop have been working with the Local Authority and Local Councillors to look at traffic calming measures around the school / shop area.

We are pleased to say that we are close to the public consultation phase, and proposed plans will be coming out for public consultation in the very near future. We would hope that, if approved, the measures will be in place for the start of the second half of the summer term (Start of June 2023). If approved, it will result in a single entrance and exit to the school – the large green gates opposite the North Inn.

Please note that the plans are with the full support of the shop and the school to keep children and other members of the community as safe as possible.

Clubs – Breakfast club and wrap around care will run as normal in the first week back, with other clubs beginning in the week of 9th January. A club letter will be sent out on Wednesday 4th January.
