Teacher Strikes - As you will be aware, the National Education Union (NEU) recently balloted it's members who voted to take strike action nationally on the following days:

Wednesday 15th March; Thursday 16th March

Please note that other local schools may also be striking on 2nd March, but Pendeen staff are not. As things stand at the date of this newsletter, **Pendeen School will be closed to children on the days above.** Other staff who are not in the NEU are not legally allowed to strike and will be working on the days above. The Department for Education has asked that schools prioritise being open for children who are vulnerable of have key worker parents - please contact me urgently by phone, e-mail or in person if you believe your child falls into these categories so we can make arrangements.
